From the Pastor's Heart: "Finally..."

It's a common running joke among preachers to note how often the apostle Paul says "Finally" in his epistles and then goes on for several more paragraphs! Well, this is going to be short and sweet because it is finally time for Karen and me to say goodbye to Covenant as I've managed to achieve the one goal of being your Interim Pastor — finally "to work myself out of a job" as you await your new called pastor.

As this is my last opportunity to communicate with you in writing as your pastor, I thought maybe we could explore together the concept of God's "guidance" since, as Christians, it is with this understanding that we move about and make decisions concerning our present and future ministries.

Knowing many of you enjoy the art of dancing, I thought you would enjoy the following meditation which poignantly and cleverly illustrates the concept of GUIDANCE:

When I meditated on the word guidance, I kept seeing "dance" at the end of the word. I remember reading that doing God's will is a lot like dancing. When two people try to lead, nothing feels right. The movement doesn't flow with the music, and everything is quite uncomfortable and jerky. However, when one person relaxes and lets the other lead, both bodies begin to flow with the music. One gives gentle cues, perhaps with a nudge to the back or by pressing lightly in one direction or another. It's as if two become one body, moving beautifully. The dance takes willingness, attentiveness, and surrender from one person, and gentle guidance and skill from the other. My eyes then drew back to the word guidance. When I saw "G," I thought of God, followed by "U" and "I" — G-U-I-DANCE — God, You, and I dance. This is what guidance means to me. As I relax and lower my head, I must become willing to trust that I will get guidance about my life. Once again, I must be willing to let God lead. — Author Unknown

It's obvious the problem we have "dancing" with God is that we often want to lead and not follow, even though Scripture is very specific that we are to "follow" (Matthew 16:24). But what I like most about this meditation is not just the part that God needs to lead, it is that you and I also need to "dance" together. And, in fact, "U" comes before "I" — and not the other way around!

In other words, in a community of faith, it's not about a lone person dancing with God but everyone doing so and with one another, always yielding to one another, with "I" being last. And that's why Jesus' final prayer for his disciples was "that they may all be one" (John 17:21), and that his "new commandment" was for them to "love one another" (John 13:34). When God's will is done, it affects all of us.

I firmly believe that in God's kingdom there are no lone rangers and that we are all ... Continued on next page


We are so proud of our youth!

Stop by the Christmas Joy Toy Drive Table and Pick up a Gift Tag!




Covenant's "Leasure" Time Book Club's Upcoming books and meetings:
