From the Pastor's Heart:

"Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ." This is the line that is common to all of the Epistles from Romans to Philemon (and a few times here or there in later letters). Sometimes the phrasing may be a little shorter, sometimes it may be a little longer. But grace to you and peace is offered as a salutation each and every time.

The next sentence was often one of thanksgiving. "First, I thank my God through Jesus Christ for all of you, because your faith is proclaimed throughout the world," (Romans 1:8). "I thank my God every time I remember you, constantly praying with joy in every one of my prayers for all of you," (Philippians 1:3-4). "In our prayers for you we always thank God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, for we have heard of your faith in Christ Jesus and of the love that you have for all the saints," (Colossians 1:3-4).

Both of these statements seem so appropriate for my first newsletter article as the pastor of Covenant Presbyterian Church. Like Paul and the other New Testament letter writers, I want to offer grace and peace to each of you. While I know that not everything in our individual or collective lives feel 100% grace-filled or peaceful, it is my prayer that in our faith together this church can be a place where all feel welcomed and loved - from our oldest or longest-standing member to our youngest or newest. Grace to all of you and peace.

The next thing in my head is not a wish or hope for us, but a fact - something that has already started and continues to occur. I give thanks to God. I give thanks to God for each of you and I give thanks for the mission and ministry of this church in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ. While I'm not sure I can truthfully claim CPC's faith is proclaimed throughout the whole world (yet), I can say it is a faith that is proclaimed strongly and proudly among us and our partners in ministry. We simply have to continue, in our prayers and in our actions, to be the kind of church who are the hands and feet of Christ's body in the world. Much like the churches in the New Testament Letters.

Another common aspect of the early churches is their desire to be together for meals, for fellowship, and for service. In my first three weeks, I have spent a good deal of time talking with our elders, deacons, and staff. We have wonderful leadership at Covenant. But, one of the things each group mentioned is that it would be helpful to have a few more folks on their committees. The Deacons are looking for folks who would be willing to help restart



Dedication of Heflin Hall ~ Sunday, December 22, 2024






- 1. The Claude and Alice Allen Memorial Scholarship: Lee County man or woman that intends to pursue higher education at a private or public institution.

Save the date: March 1st is InAsMuch Event Day! This is a multi-denominational volunteer day of service for people in our community in need. Your gifts, talents, and time can be used in many ways:

- Blessing bags for the homeless
- Creating Kindness cards for nursing homes
- Free laundry service for individuals
- Minor home repairs
- Landscape mulching
- Bag of Hope for Foster children

Covenant has led this project for 13 years. We began by filling 50 bags with gently used clothing. Today, we fill 270 bags with all new items, sizes newborn to 12 years old. When a child is removed from a dangerous situation, they are frightened and only take what they are wearing. Our bags are filled with basic necessities including a dress outfit, 2-3 playsets, pajamas, underwear, toiletries, and socks. Offering as much love and comfort that we can offer means a snuggle fleece throw or quilt, a plush-lovey toy and books.

We will be asking for your support and answering any questions in the church courtyard after church during February. Also, help is needed in sorting and prepacking during February 24-28.




